### WHAT



#### ARE ANNOTATIONS?

notes or comments that a driver or motor carrier enters into an ELD record to provide more detail on their hours of service, such as why a log edit was made or to note the use of a special exception

#### Common annotations explain:



Personal use of a CMV



A log edit



Why a movement qualifies as a “yard move”



On-duty time



Use of an exception

#### ARE ANNOTATIONS REQUIRED?



A log edit



PC or yard moves



Use of an exception



Other (when prompted)

### WHY



#### SHOULD I ANNOTATE?

Avoid risk

Maximum fine per violation

Failing to enter required annotations

**\$1,292**

Missing annotations (driver)

**\$3,923**

Missing annotations (motor carrier)

**\$15,691**

Roadside Inspection Citations

**1K** Failure to annotate ELD records

Almost 1,000 drivers cited for failing to annotate ELD records

**274** Failure to annotate special driving category or exempt status

274 drivers cited for failing to annotate special driving category or exempt status

### HOW



#### MUCH SHOULD I ANNOTATE?

At least 4 characters (including spaces), but no more than 60 characters total are required for each annotation.
